	TRIUMPHAL ENTRY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 6 days before the Passover, Jesus travels from Ephraim to Bethany (7-8 miles) and had a supper with Lazarus (Jn.12:1). The "Next day," (Jn.12:12)i.e., 5 days before the Passover, the multitude brought palm branches and cried "Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord" (Jn.12:13). 	
	TEACHING AND MIRACLES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Jesus has the Passover meal with His disciples. It was "at evening" (Mt.26:12), which technically made it the Nisan 13 (See Mk.14:12-25; Lk.22:7-23; Jn.13:1-4). 	
	THE LORD'S SUPPER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Jesus died on "the Preparation day" (Mt.26:17-19; Mk.15:42; Lu.22:7-13; Jn.19:14, 31, 42), i.e., the day before the Passover Sabbath. Jesus' body placed in the tomb ("heart of the earth") before the Passover Sabbath (Lu.23:54; Jn.19:15). "Later" Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus (Jn.19:38). Joseph went to the market to buy fine linen (Mk.15:46). The women of Galilee saw where Jesus was placed in the tomb, then returned to prepare spices, then rested on the Sabbath (Lk.23:55-56). 	
	CHRIST IS CRUCIFIED	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The tomb was sealed by the Romans (Mt.27:62-66). Matthew called it "the next day, the one after Preparation Day" so that it would not be confused with the weekly sabbath. 1st month (Nisan 14) at twilight starts the Lord's Passover (Le.23:5). On the 1st day of the 7 days of Unleavened Bread, no laborious work is to be done (Le.23:7). For 7 days they shall present an offering before the LORD (Le.23:8). 	
	PASSOVER SABBATH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nisan 15 starts the Feast of Unleavened Bread to the LORD (Le.23:6). The first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread is holy, and no work is to be done (Le.23:7). 	
	UNLEAVENED SABBATH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Then "on the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment" (Lk.23:56b). 	
	WEEKLY SABBATH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The 2 Marys, "when the Sabbath was over," bought spices (Mk.16:1). "After the Sabbath" (Mt.28:1) is plural, that is, after the "Sabbaths". Christ was in the grave through 2 Sabbaths (Lk.23:55-56). After the resurrection, Christ and two men walked on the road to Emmaus. They made reference to the fact that it was the third day "since" the death and burial of Jesus (Lk. 24:13-32).
